Turkey-Syria Earthquake - We're all shocked by the devastation and loss of life, homes and livelihoods in Turkey and Syria through the earthquakes. The issues and needs are enormous and CAFOD's Emergency Response Teams are there assessing needs on the ground. CAFOD has already been working in Syria for years providing humanitarian support to the millions of needy people caught up in the conflict there for the last 12 years. This tragedy adds to an already desperate crisis. Lent - begins on Ash Wednesday 22 February. January seemed to go by very quickly and Lent will be with us sooner than we think. I suggest each of us begins to ponder on how we'd like to spend the weeks of Lent. It's a time to prepare for the events of Holy Week and Easter. We need to choose something that brings us closer to the Lord, that improves our lives and relationships. You'll get a lot out of a slow reading of one of the Gospels and our prayer life should be looked at to see if we want to change anything. We may wish to include more thanks and praise alongside any requests we make. Do ask if you need any help. Thanks.

Is there anyone in your family or acquaintances to whom you might raise a question about whether they may be interested in learning more about faith, about God, about the Church? You could be a great help in making an opportunity for the Holy Spirit to enter and initiate a journey of faith in an individual's life. I'm always happy to help and to answer any questions.
