We should hear soon. Keep his young family in your prayers please. Thank you. When we are able to stream from YouTube there'll be a note on the parish Facebook page directing you onwards. Masses are available from many places by accessing <u>churchservices.tv</u>. Having Mass from our own parish helps keep a sense of community in our worship and some solidarity with others even though we're unable to see them.

If you are free and able to take some moments of quiet at home at 10am - to join in a heartfelt way with the power and beauty of the Mass - it will be a sign and experience of our parish family. Just being aware of Mass being offered daily in the parish is a bonding initiative that can become more and more important to us. You may have heard that joining in Mass when not physically present is sometimes called an Act of Spiritual Communion. Do this by sitting quietly and be aware you are in God's presence. Identify with Mass being offered and make a simple prayer like this:

Great and gentle God, present among us, I love you as strongly as I am able. I deeply desire to receive you at Mass. Join me in Communion with you and all in your body, the Church, and keep me united with you forever. Amen

<u>Vocations Sunday</u> - is next Sunday. Please recognise the responsibility we all have to pray for everyone's vocation. Yours (yes, you are called by God to live out the Gospel message) mine and all others. Our custom and a requirement from the Lord himself, is that we also pray for an increase in vocations to the priesthood and the religious life. That need is being felt more acutely as the years go by and more keenly in countries with fewer priests and religious than ours. Everything is relative. In our lifetime's experience we now have many priests less than we once had. But compared with other countries we are still much better provided for than they are. Our prayers should not be selfish, the world's needs are greater than our own. Thank you.
