EASTER LIGHT

Jesus lights up the landscape; and what St John tell us is that one bit of the landscape that he lights up is the Bible itself. The disciples haven't known how to read their own scriptures until now; but they come to see that the events of Good Friday are part of the pattern of God's work with his people all along. Salvation and renewal always come as people are shocked into the recognition of how deeply they have betrayed God.

God is always faithful to his people, even when all they have to give him is rejection and contempt. And no human rejection can destroy God's longing to be with those he loves. This is what that first Easter morning begins to get across to them. Not even the torturing to death of Jesus can change this love; and so when the disciples come looking for a body, they find an empty grace - like a door open into God's future.
