Among the Poor - parish workers in East - Harlem, USA

THEY HAD CAUGHT something from Christ, I thought. Some-L thing of who he was and is flickered out through who they were. It is not easy to describe. It was compassion without sentimentality as much as anything else, I think—a lucid, cool, grave compassion. If it had a color, it would be a pale. northern blue. They never seemed to romanticize the junkies and winos and deadbeats and losers they worked among, and they never seemed to let pity or empathy distort the clarity with which they saw them for no more if no less than what they were. Insofar as they were able to approach loving them, I got the impression that they did so not just in spite of everything about them that was neither lovely nor lovable but right in the thick of it. There was a kind of sad gaiety about the way they went about their work. The sadness stemmed, I suppose, from the hopelessness of their task—the problems were so vast, their resources for dealing with them were so meager-and the gaiety from a hope beyond hope that, in the long run if not the short, all would in some holy and unimaginable way be well. If, as I suspect, they looked at me and at the others who worked there only part-time as less committed than they, farther away from where the real battle was being fought, then I can say only that, of course, they were right. But they seemed less to hold the difference against us than simply to mark it and leave it for us to come to terms with as best we could.

<u>CAFOD</u> - To walkers, joggers, dog owners, globe trotters and all who like some fresh air including kids - will you help change the world? Cafod works to enable people around the globe to manage for themselves and their families. For many folks water is a scarce resource and becoming more and more scarce as the seasons become drier and hotter. So would you please join <u>Cafod's Big</u> Walk for Water challenge.

Cafod's Family Fast Day is on Friday 26 February, but during Lent please help people in Ethiopia like Abdella, a man who walks for 10 hours a day to find water for his family. He's shattered and exhausted. He has no time for anything else. We need to help him and others.

So I'm looking for 10 people to do a 4 mile walk once a week each week of the 6.5 weeks of Lent. It means together we'll cover approximately 250 miles. I have 3 people already. Ring me (Fr D) on 603431 if you're on. We're also looking for sponsorship. Remember the money will help Abdella and others by providing solar-powered water pumps, flowing water to cultivate their land and training in farming techniques. Let's see how much we can raise. Walkers please ring me and see if you can get sponsors for your walking. Be inspired by Captain Sir Tom Moore. We should hopefully raise £1000 to help. Step up and out. Pick up the phone. Thank you.

<u>Lent -</u> begins on Ash Wednesday, 17 February - a week this Wednesday. It's a special time for all of us as we make efforts to apply ourselves more sincerely to aspects of our faith and Gospel teaching.

This year, given the restrictions we live with, could we be more focussed and imaginative about how we choose to spend our Lenten time? One of the big learnings most folks experience is the loss of simple human contact. Although we cannot break the rules about meeting people, it is easily within our ability to make contact by other means - phones, laptops and so on. Writing and posting a card (if you're able) can mean a great deal to the recipient. Contacting 2 or 3 people each day will help a lot.
